GETTING HERE

PUBLIC TRANSPORT:

The Dukes is just a few minutes walk from both Lancaster Train station and Bus station.

FROM THE SOUTH:

Leave the M6 motorway at junction 33 and take the A6 to Lancaster. Follow directions to the city centre and on joining the one way system, keep in the left-hand lane and you will see brown information signs for The Dukes.

FROM THE NORTH:

Leave the M6 motorway at junction 34 and follow signs for Lancaster. On joining the one way system, keep in the left-hand lane and you will see brown information signs for The Dukes.

PARKING:

Ample pay and display parking is available within a two minute walk of The Dukes. Bike racks are located on Moor Lane close to The Dukes.
