Taking place between July 2021 and April 2022, the Young Practitioners Scheme will offer 6 aspiring creatives between the ages of **16 and 21** a **FREE** opportunity to gain experience and training in Youth and Community work.

What will you do?

- Take part in a range of development opportunities including Safeguarding and First Aid training
- Help lead our Summer School and weekly Youth Theatre workshops
- Learn what it takes to be a freelance practitioner
- Attend master classes to learn important industry skills such as budgeting and marketing
- Attend 1:1 mentoring

We are looking for:

Individuals between the ages of **16 and 21** who have

- A passion for theatre and the creative arts
- A willingness to challenge themselves and learn new things
- Energy, enthusiasm, and a desire to be part of the creative sector
- An interest in working creatively with people of all abilities and ages
- An ability to work both independently and as part of a collaborative scheme
- A willingness to commit to the scheme

What will you gain?

- Experience working with young people in a creative setting
- A toolkit of drama techniques, skills, and knowledge
- An opportunity to develop transferable skills in team work, leadership, communication, imaginative thinking, and problem-solving
- Useful training in Safeguarding and First Aid
- A reference for your CV
- Contacts in the field
- Funding for expenses

How does it work?



Time Commitment

During the summer you will be expected to assist for at least 2 days on our week-long summer school.

During the Autumn and Spring terms, you will be expected to assist at least once a week in the Youth Theatre sessions.

You will also have 1:1 meetings with your mentor every 4 weeks.
